### 1.2. RECOMMENDED USE AND RESTRICTIONS ON USE

This product is intended for use only by adults 21 or older. For lawful use only. This product is concentrated and should not be used undiluted. Not for use with tobacco or nicotine. Avoid contact with the skin, eyes, wood surfaces, and fabrics. Keep out of reach of children and pets. Consumers should determine and conduct their own safety standards and testing. The United States Food and Drug Administration, Center for Disease Control and Prevention, and multiple state governments are investigating numerous instances of severe respiratory illnesses and deaths associated with the use of vaping products.
